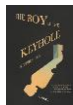

Did You Know? Library Resources

Each month we will be highlighting a different library resource. These resources are either in print form, a service, or in an online format. This month is on **MyHeritage**. MyHeritage is a resource people can use to discover, share and preserve family histories both nationwide and worldwide.



This service is free to use using your Infosoup library card at your local library, on

your mobile and in your own home! This is one of the most convenient and easy-to-use resource to help anyone learn more about their family history. It has a multi-language support available in 40 different languages.

Here are some of the different types of records available on MyHeritage –

- More than 9 billion historical records
- USA federal census (1790-1940) and UK census (1841-1901)
- 3 billion exclusive family tree profiles from MyHeritage and Geni
- Tombstone photos
- Historical Photographs
- Military records, immigration records and passenger lists
- Wills and probate records

And so much more! Stop by to pick up a brochure or ask how to use MyHeritage from our library staff.



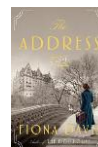

Looking to get fines off of your child's library card? We are offering a Read for Fines program this year for the

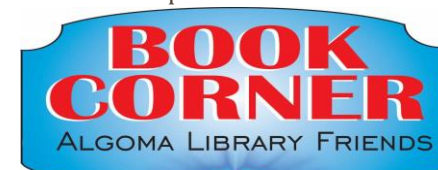
