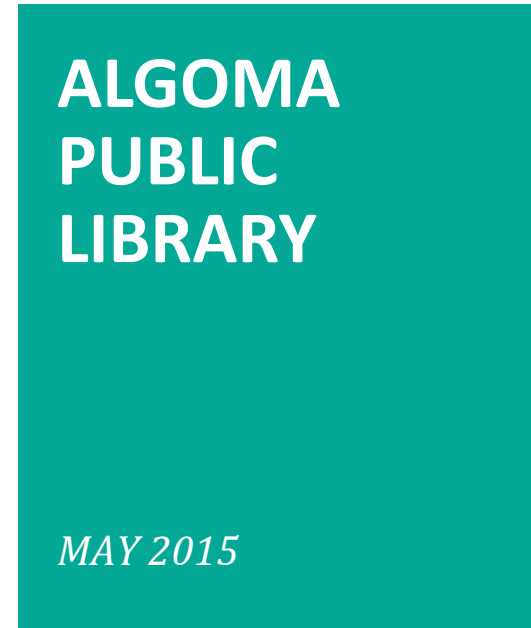
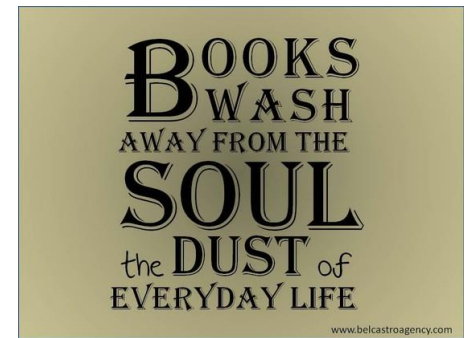
### Internet Hour
